NOTES FROM THE PASTURE

Adapted from speech given at 2021 Annual Meeting

This past year, I adopted the motto "Onward & Upward." To me, it meant looking for the positive, being problem solvers, staying the course, and placing our beloved breed first. Unfortunately, not everyone has adopted this sentiment. Resulting in threats, mistruths, gossip, petty behavior, and secrecy. Attempting to create an atmosphere of control and fear. I had hoped to avoid the necessity of addressing this community wide, but it has become evident I must.

"You will have to change to go to new levels. Change should mean growth. Those who aren't prepared for new levels will ask you to remain the same; but that's only because Greatness makes them uncomfortable." ~Tony Gaskins

This quote is a perfect summary of the range of reactions our community is experiencing. The formalization of the SCIGBA in 2019 has exposed growing pains and fissures. I have no doubt these will continue during the upcoming years, but we must move *Onward and Upward*.

Analyzing our history, I believe our issues stem from the breed's conservation origin. Unlike other rare heritage breeds, initial attention was brought to SCI Goats through animal rescue and not a livestock / agriculture organization. These initial champions lacked the foresight to understand the organizational structure needed to build a sustainable, genetically diverse population for the future. In the forty years since removal from the island, the San Clemente Island Goat population and community suffered due to the lack of a formal breed association. It was from this void the SCIGBA emerged.

While our pure conservation breeders were and are essential, we need to embrace an equally important, second parallel path in order to move the breed forward and secure a future for San Clemente Island Goats. That path is utilization, new breeders, and promotion. Whether it be meat, dairy, fiber, brush, or therapy; SCIs not only need a purpose on paper, but on actual farms. We pay homage to our long time breeders while welcoming in fresh faces to help move SCI Goats into the next phase. Both are equally important.



The purpose of the project is to create and maintain a comprehensive pedigree database on SCI goats and herds – past, present and future. Features of the database include programs to perform trial mating charts with inbreeding coefficients. This useful resource can assist you as a conservation breeder in making decisions to achieve herd goals as well as track, evaluate, and manage the genetic diversity for long term survival of the breed.

Enrollment to add your herd. Then add your purebred goats by clicking the **Add Purebred** and your crossbred goats by clicking **Add Crossbreed** (We want to keep track of crossbreeds to ensure they are not mistaken for Purebreds in the future.) Don't have answers to all the questions? No problem! Just fill out what you can, every bit of information helps! If you need more room or find spreadsheets easier, let us know and we can send over an Excel form for your herd. Please include all registered and unregistered goats. Even if you have already given us information on your herd, please fill out these forms with your updates. This will also give us a complete picture for a 2021 Census!
